Dear Mayor Elorza:

As organizations and individuals who have worked for many years to protect the rights of the poor and the homeless, we write to commend you for vowing to veto the ordinance passed by the City Council last Wednesday banning smoking around the Kennedy Plaza area.

We know that, rather than serving as a public health measure, this ordinance will be disproportionately used against the poor and the homeless in an attempt to displace them from this public downtown area.

We know that harried office workers, unable to smoke in their offices, will not be charged under this ordinance when they run downstairs to have a smoke right outside their building – a scene that anybody walking downtown is quite familiar with.

We know that enforcement of an ordinance like this is, as your Commissioner of Public Safety has noted on numerous occasions, a great waste of limited police resources.

First the Council banned smoking in the nearby public parks in an attempt to move the homeless away from those areas. A victim of their own success, Council members now seek to move the homeless away from the Kennedy Plaza area as well. But the downtown area should be a public space for everybody, and this attempt to shuffle the poor around in order to hide the poverty that exists in the City is unseemly and ultimately self-defeating.

Again, we appreciate your stated decision to veto this troubling ordinance. By copy of this letter, we strongly urge the City Council not to override that veto.
