STATEMENT OF MICHAEL CLARK IN SUPPORT OF CHARGE OF DISCRIMINATION

- 1. I have been subjected to discriminatory terms and conditions of employment and unlawful termination due to my race and color by my employer City of Providence, RI. I was hired as a recruit to the 69th Police Academy of the City of Providence for training to join the Providence Police Department upon completion of training. I was employed commencing on or about January 7, 2019 until I was involuntarily dismissed from the Academy on or about May 31, 2019, three weeks before graduation.
- 2. Throughout my tenure at the Academy, I was subjected to discriminatory terms and conditions, harassed, ostracized and humiliated based upon my race and color and perceptions of me based upon negative racial stereotypes, and ultimately dismissed from the program before I could graduate, foreclosing my opportunity to become a full-time member of the Police Department.
- 3. I believe that I have been discriminated against on the basis of my race and color (African-American) as follows:
 - a. From the outset of the Academy, I was singled out by the training officers running the Academy for the City on the basis of a perception that I did not fit in because I had previously written and performed a song to which they took offense and to which they attributed negative racial stereotypes. The song, which was in the "Christian rap" genre, made reference to black men being killed by police, requests to police "Don't' shoot", calls for unity among all people and a cry out to God.
 - b. I was singled out from the very first day, when I was taunted by the Training Officers and directed to put on a "durag" and told to sing for the rest of the recruit class. (When I told them I had no songs to sing, I was required to do calisthenics in front of the class and to remain standing in front of the class.)
 - c. Thereafter, I was singled out for additional assignments, held out to my peers as someone who did not fit in, subjected to off-the-job surveillance, and subjected to humiliation and harassment by the training officers running the Academy and their superiors in command on behalf of the City throughout my tenure.
 - d. I was given extracurricular assignments other recruits were not given and then given demerits based on the Training officers' judgment that I had poorly executed those assignments.
 - e. Among the other additional assignments I was given, I was required to write a positive song about the police and required to perform it in front of the Training Officers.
 - f. As part of a training exercise on use of a Taser and its impact, while other recruits received a single Taser shock, I was subjected to repeated Taser shocks while I crawled across the floor to a set goal, leaving me bleeding and with my skin burned.

g. Despite the pervasive harassment, I performed all objective measurements satisfactorily. I continued to pass all of the academic and physical fitness requirements, attended every day of class, passed the field training units, and was in the elite running squad.

h. Instead of graduating, I was dismissed from the Academy on the basis that I

had accumulated too many "demerits."

 I believe that the actions of the City were undertaken as part of an ongoing campaign to oust me from the program due to their perception of me as the "wrong kind" of person of color.

j. These actions are in violation of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, the Rhode Island Fair Employment Practices Act, and the Rhode Island Civil Rights Act, as well as a violation of my rights under the First and Fourteenth Amendments to the United States Constitution (I recognize that the

latter claims are beyond the Commission's jurisdiction).

k. As a direct result of these actions, I have been denied the opportunity to pursue a career in law enforcement, subjected to sustained and outrageous humiliation, lost and continue to lose substantial economic opportunities, compensation and benefits and have suffered and continue to suffer non-economic injuries, including personal humiliation, embarrassment and distress.

Because I intend to pursue this matter in federal court at the earliest opportunity, I respectfully pray that each Commission terminate its proceedings as early as possible and issue me a Notice of Right to Sue thereon.
