PLAINTIFFS' MOTION FOR PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION

Pursuant to Rule 65(a) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, the Religious Land Use and Institutionalized Persons Act, 42 U.S.C. § 2000cc et seg., Plaintiffs move this Court to issue a Preliminary Injunction requiring Defendants, the Defendants' officers, agents, servants, employees, and attorneys; and other persons who are in active concert or participation who receive actual notice of it by personal service or otherwise:

- 1. To allow Plaintiffs to participate in Native American ceremonies, including pipe ceremonies, sweat lodge ceremonies, drum circles, smudging ceremonies, and powwows;
- 2. To allow Plaintiffs to obtain Native American religious items, including medicine bags, feathers and bird parts, and dreamcatchers;
 - 3. To make available a diet consistent with Plaintiffs' religious traditions; and
 - 4. To allow Plaintiffs to obtain religious counsel and guidance.

Complaint, Exhibits filed in support of the within motion and a supporting memorandum of law.
